

Travel tips involving wheelchair users

"We can't be the first family with a wheelchair to do this" said former travel consultant Julie Jones, on her recently created website 'Have Wheelchair Will Travel'

Julie has been travelling since childhood when her family took her out of school for six months to explore Europe, Egypt and Scandinavia. She was determined to show the wonders of the world to her own family and the birth of her son diagnosed with Cerebral Palsy did not deter her from her goal.

"As an ex travel consultant I put a lot of time and effort into researching and planning our trip and we had a fantastic time. When we returned it seemed a waste not to share the information with more people and that was when the website idea became a reality. The idea of sharing the information about our USA trip then grew into sharing information about our home city, Sydney with others coming from overseas and it is now an ongoing work in progress," said Julie

There are great tips throughout the website. For example a full wheelchair service is essential and a basic repair kit is highly recommended. Julie made sure there was a lot of built in storage on her son's wheelchair.

"We had pockets sewn into our son's wheelchair to add to the amount it could carry. We have a deep zippered pocket on the backrest of the chair which saves me carrying a handbag as it fits keys, wallet, a drink and other bits and pieces. The deeper the pocket the better. We have a netting carry all underneath where we put jumpers etc and under the seat we have a zippered pocket. This is hidden by our son's legs when he is in the chair and it proved the perfect place to keep our passports, extra cash and ipad," said Julie.
